REMINDER CanScreen-ECIS - User Insights Study

The results from the CanScreen-ECIS Project (EU4Health programme). are meant to be integrated into the European Cancer Information System (ECIS).

A user insights survey was launched as a qualitative study to understand the needs and expectations of the ECIS portal as a repository for data on cancer screening in Europe.

IACR Report on European Cancer Registries 2022-2023

The report about European Cancer Registries was compiled by the European representative in the IACR board after surveying the individual European cancer registries, as well as national and regional networks in Europe about their activities over the past year.

ENCR data call to update ECIS - status

A data call was launched in late 2022 to the ENCR registries to update ECIS. The release of the updated version of the JRC-ENCR Quality Checks software (QCS 2.1.1) in November 2023 was an essential step that will allow the validation to progress faster, ensuring comparability of the cancer registries data across Europe.

While the validation of the data has initiated its 2nd phase, with planned publication during 2024, CRs having already submitted data, but with more recent incidence data available, are invited to update their submission.

Dutch Cancer Atlas in English

The Dutch Cancer Atlas, launched in January 2023 by the Netherlands Comprehensive Cancer Organisation (IKNL) is now available also in English.

The interactive online atlas shows geographical patterns in cancer diagnoses, based on where people lived when they were diagnosed.

First nationwide publication from Belgium CR focusing on primary brain and other CNS tumours

The Belgian Cancer Registry announces its new publication: "Primary brain and other central nervous system (CNS) tumours in adults in Belgium 2004-2020". Epidemiological data on incidence, prevalence, survival, trends, and projections are presented. All chapters of the publication are divided by primary location of the tumour and provide results based on sex, age group, histological subtype and behaviour of the tumour.

The long-term accessibility of Cancer Registry data, January 2024
