

**93rd ENCR Steering Committee (SC) Meeting
and Meeting of the JRC-ENCR Management Committee minutes**

Date and place: 03 April 2025, Videoconference

Attendees: ENCR SC, JRC-ENCR Management Committee, Representatives from the European Commission Joint Research Centre (JRC)

Welcome and adoption of the minutes of the 92nd ENCR SC meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved with a minor modification.

ECIS release

- A new release of the ECIS on the 7th of April will publish the most up-to-date historical incidence and mortality data from general (all-ages) population-based cancer registries, in a new ECIS web interface. The ECIS historical database now covers data from 128 registries and 32 countries.
- The list of historical cancer entities has also been updated, now covering 68 entities. The 2018 data from CRs not having submitted a more recent contribution have been converted into these new cancer entities.
- 2024 estimates and historical data on childhood cancers will also be published in Autumn 2025.

GRELL-ENCR conference 2025

The ENCR SC discussed the outcomes of abstracts' revision, selection of keynote speakers and the agenda for the ENCR Activities and Scientific Updates session.

ENCR recommendations and working groups (WGs)

- Multiple primary tumours: A meeting to review the final draft of the recommendation is to be organised.
- Survival: The first three subgroups are now at the stage of formulating position papers. The first meeting of the 4th subgroup (survival from registries providing aggregated contribution to ECIS) took place on the 2nd of April, where the Nordcan experience was presented.
- Haematological malignancies: The group will restart the work after finalisation of ICD-O-4 codes.
- Non-melanoma skin cancers: A preparatory meeting between JRC, IARC and the WG chair took place. The first meeting of the WG is scheduled for 9 April.
- New working group on AI and IT tools for cancer registration: The core group will meet to revise received candidatures to the WG and decide on the next steps.

Site visit to Moldova

Moldova recently passed a law making cancer registration mandatory for healthcare providers and a population-based Cancer Registry is being established. The site visit in Moldova was conducted 26-28 March by the representatives of the JRC, ENCR SC and IARC, who reported on the local situation and what kind of support is needed.
